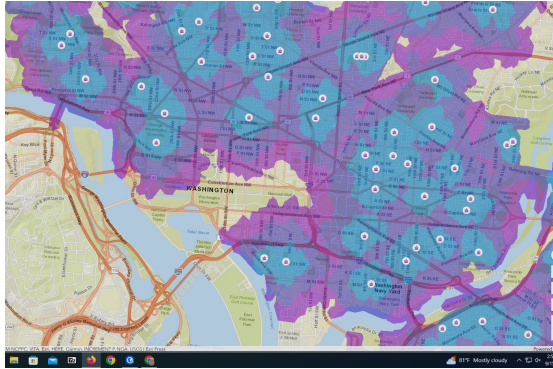


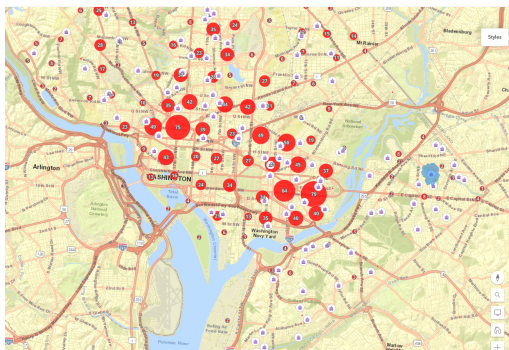
Chapter 1:

My map after messing around with the colors and various settings:

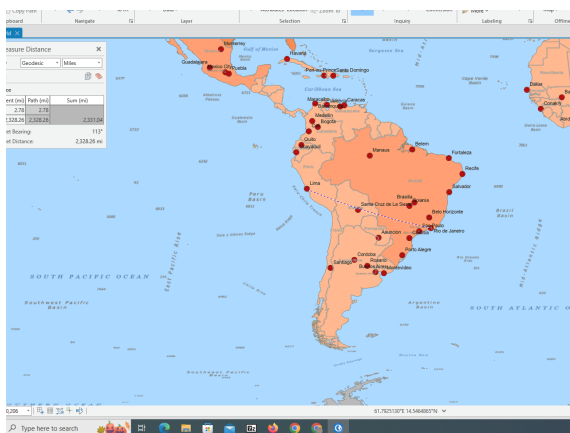


The following exercises strayed from the book a little bit in terms of the format of the software so I had to do some poking around to figure out the right steps. This is how my next map turned out.



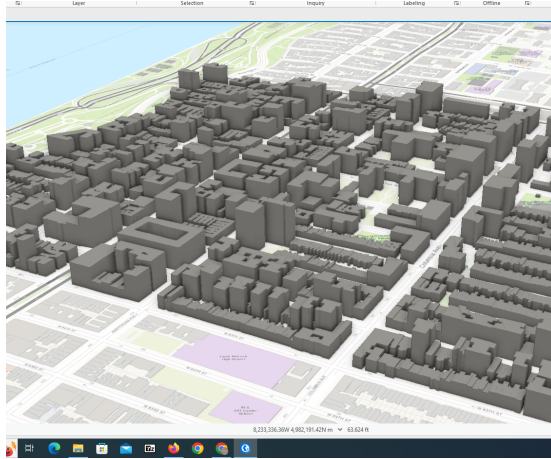
Chapter 2:

The next map wasn't too hard to create, and it was interesting to see how easily I could measure the distances between locations

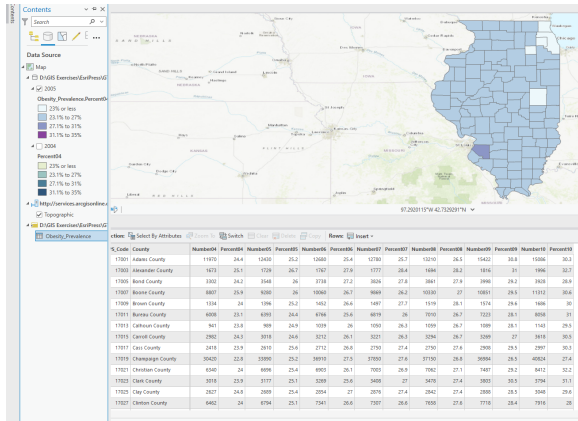


3D GIS:
